

RAF Global in Mozambique

Overview 2024

Since 2015, RAF Global has been actively engaged in Mozambique, implementing diverse and long-term initiatives across the sectors of livelihoods, education, public health, nutrition, and water and sanitation in Gaza and Maputo provinces. The main areas of intervention include three districts in Gaza – Bilene, Chongoene, and Limpopo – and Matola in Maputo. With a Human Development Index ranking of 185 out of 191, Mozambique remains one of the world's poorest nations, where 74 per cent of the population lives below the international poverty line of \$2.15 per day¹. Women, reportedly, face widespread gender-based violence, limited economic opportunities, and a disproportionately high prevalence of HIV/AIDS. It is estimated that over 53 per cent of girls are married before the age of 18, and the HIV prevalence among women aged 15–24 stands at 7.1 per cent, more than double that of men (2.8 per cent)².

With a view to addressing the complex socio-economic challenges and severe humanitarian crises in the communities that RAF Global works with, it has rolled out community empowerment and humanitarian aid programmes. Over the years, RAF Global has built strong collaborations with the Provincial Government, sectoral departments, civil society organisations, and a diverse network of institutional and individual donors. These strategic partnerships have laid a foundation for a multifaceted approach, aimed at improving quality of life, fostering sustainable development, and enhancing community resilience.

The year in review


During the period under review, a total of 1,02,957 individuals were reached through the organisation's initiatives. Among them, 16 per cent benefitted from more than one initiative of the organisation. A reported 53 per cent of people drawing benefits from the programme were women. 

Programme Account



Health and Nutrition Initiatives

RAF Global employs a holistic, impact-driven strategy to work towards improved healthcare, nutrition, and community well-being in underserved regions of Mozambique. By integrating direct service provision, capacity building, preventive healthcare, and community empowerment, the organisation aims to ensure both, immediate relief and long-term resilience. The organisation works through diverse initiatives in areas of nutrition and food security, healthcare infrastructure, water and sanitation, health awareness and education, medical outreach and health camps.

In the reporting period, RAF Global positively impacted **55,127** lives through its healthcare initiatives, of whom **8 per cent** are estimated to have received benefits from two or more initiatives of the organisation.

Women represented **52 per cent** of the total individuals who benefitted from health and nutrition initiatives.

Strengthening the healthcare system

Nutrition care

Since 2018, RAF Global has worked to provide healthy meals to vulnerable children and elderly individuals through its Bhojan project at the Centre of Aspiration for Youths in Mozambique (CAYM), the programme campus in Machava in Maputo. RAF Global operates an in-house kitchen that prepares fresh mid-day meals for pre-schoolers at CAYM's Early Childhood Development (ECD) centre, for abandoned senior citizens, and for children from vulnerable backgrounds. Expanding its reach beyond Maputo, the programme also serves mid-day meals at the organisation's ECD centres in Gaza province in collaboration with Olam in 2023. During the review period, 469 individuals benefitted from these efforts. Additionally, since 2017, RAF Global has been providing financial support for monthly kitchen groceries to orphanages



in Maputo – Dom Orione, a home for children with cerebral palsy, and Associação dos Amigos de Crianças Órfãs de Sida (AACOSIDA). This is estimated to have benefitted 195 children in 2024.

Advancing medical services at healthcare centres

An incubator and an infant radiant warmer were contributed to health centres in Chissano and Chongoene during the review period. These items are envisaged to help provide life-saving assistance to 14,268 infants every year. Last year, these health institutions also received refurbishment support. Along with the 2022 donation of an infant radiant warmer to the Macia Health Centre in the Bilene district, RAF Global contributed a slit lamp and a Stomatology chair during the review period, which is expected to serve 19,812 patients annually.



Cataract treatment

RAF Global procured cataract surgical kits – surgical instruments, consumables, medications, and disposables – for Mavalane Hospital in Maputo, which helped in conducting 108 cataract surgeries in the review period. Four surgeries referred by the organisation were carried out at Provincial Hospital of Xai-Xai in Gaza. More than half of those who received treatment were women.



Water and sanitation

RAF Global facilitated the safe water to access 15,098 villagers in their vicinity, of whom 43 per cent are estimated to be women and girls. Under the initiative, 21 boreholes were repaired in Bilene, Limpopo, and the Chongoene district of Gaza province in collaboration with Ananda Marga Universal Relief Team (AMURT) and Lucky Trading Company. Additionally, 1,174 community people received soaps donated by Olam and 243 individuals with clothes donated by Thread-Dressing Future Leaders.

For years, the community of Messano in Bilene faced severe water scarcity, forcing women and girls to walk long distances to fetch water from sources considered unsafe. Limited awareness of water treatment led to frequent outbreaks of cholera and diarrhoeal diseases.



In October 2024, RAF Global, in partnership with AMURT, Lucky Trading Company and local leaders, rehabilitated a borehole that had been non-functional since 2016, restoring access to clean water for 150 families (450 people). Among the beneficiaries was Leonor Armando Mavui, a 26-year-old mother of two, who previously walked 8 km daily, in search of water, often leaving her children without food or schooling.

With clean water now readily available, Leonor has more time for her family and aims to pursue a business or vocational training for financial stability. She is also appointed as leader of the local water committee which ensures the borehole's maintenance and hygiene. Leonor's story demonstrates how clean water can change lives, offering dignity, opportunity, and hope for a better future.

Health camps and awareness in schools

During the review period, various health awareness sessions were conducted for students in government schools in Gaza province. The initiatives were carried with Provincial Health Directorate, District Services for Women, Health and Social Action, and Provincial Hospital of Xai-Xai.

In Limpopo district, students from five primary schools received hand-hygiene education with practical handwashing demonstrations, while 675 children from five schools in Chongoene and Bilene were educated on malaria and HIV. Furthermore, the schools benefitted from ear care screening camps, facilitating timely wax removal and early detection of hearing issues. Additionally, 440 female students from two secondary schools in Limpopo were trained in making eco-friendly sanitary pads. In all, 2,372 students from 12 schools have participated and among them 61 per cent were girls.



Community-based health camps

Four health camps were organised across different regions of Limpopo, providing general check-ups and medical services to 1,161 individuals in which 208 individuals diagnosed with hearing problem, were provided hearing-aid. Two dedicated eye camps were held, reaching out to 223 people, of whom 60 per cent were women. Among them, 11 persons diagnosed with cataracts were referred to hospitals for surgery. The camps were conducted in collaboration with Provincial Health Directorate, District Services for Women, Health and Social Action, and doctors from Chicumbane Hospital, Chongoene Health Center, and Provincial Hospital of Xai-Xai.



Economic Integration and Livelihood Support for Women and Youth

RAF Global's interventions with women and youth, aim to foster sustainable economic empowerment through skill-building, financial inclusion, entrepreneurship, and leadership development. The organisation employs a comprehensive and gender inclusive approach to impart professional skills and access to financial resources. The long-term objective is to reduce dependency and foster resilience, while promoting local economic growth through community-led initiatives of self-help groups and micro loans.

In the year in review, **1,477** individuals participated in Economic Integration and Livelihood Support initiatives, of whom, nearly **28 per cent** were part of other initiatives as well.


Women represented **66 per cent** of all programme participants.

Skill building

In the review period, 1,442 individuals received training in professional courses under the skill building programme in Maputo and Gaza, a one-and-a-half times increase from the previous year and nearly three-fold growth from 2022. In Gaza, 732 women and men from Chongoene, Limpopo and Bilene districts, and 710 people from Maputo province received training at skill building centres. The centres provided certificate courses in tailoring, basic beauty and grooming, electrical course, basic electronics, welding, plumbing and auto-mechanic skills. Participants in mobile banking course were trained in collaboration with Movitel SA (mobile telecommunication operator based in Mozambique).

Seeding entrepreneurial futures

Social enterprise fund

RAF Global provided seed capital to 40 students by equipping them with essential business tools and practice kits, such as sewing machines, cosmetics kits, and electrical kits. These resources have enabled recipients to establish their own startups, fostering entrepreneurship and self-reliance. Women made up nearly 60 per cent of the recipients during the review year.

Internships and placements

In 2024, RAF Global partnered with nine companies for facilitating internship opportunities for students, eight of which are in the domain of electricity and plumbing and one in welding. In all, 64 students were part of internships, among whom, 30 were women. Nine women from tailoring course were selected by MOZTEX, an apparel manufacturing company, at a monthly salary of 8,320 meticals (USD 130). For most of the recruits, this is the first opportunity to earn a steady income.



When Aida Matsinhe from Limpopo district, joined the RAF Global tailoring course in July 2024, she had never used a sewing machine. Determined to learn, she quickly developed the skills to create garments - an achievement that not only boosted her confidence but also changed her life. Soon, Aida began taking orders from neighbours. Earning approximately 3,000 meticals³ per month, she now contributes to her family's financial security while also designing clothes for herself and her loved ones. With a vision to grow, Aida aspires to establish her own tailoring business, using her expertise to further support her family and inspire others in her community to pursue vocational training.

Microloan

RAF Global channelises interest-free loans to small vendors, to help them expand their business capital and increase profits through higher sales. During the review period, six people, including five women received loans of 10,000 meticals each for businesses selling food items, cosmetics, and clothing. Additionally, 23 students from the mobile banking course received loans of 5,000 meticals each to launch their ventures as mobile banking agents under the Emola Mobile Banking service. Two self-help groups from Limpopo district each received a loan of 10,000 meticals each, empowering them to expand their ventures and enhance economic stability within their communities. Many of those who will benefit from the enterprise loans, will be able to earn cash income for the first time in their lives.



Financial literacy and personal development

In collaboration with Movitel, a workshop on business and financial management was organised on mobile banking for students and small vendors who received micro-loans during the year. In addition, workshops on leadership and self-esteem were organised for vocational students in Limpopo, Chongoene and Xai-Xai. The sessions were conducted by resource persons from Universidade Save and AJEGA (Associação dos Jovens Empreendedores de Gaza, or Gaza Young Entrepreneurs' Association). Thirty students received training in making eco-friendly sanitary pads, in Bilene. Dedicated classes on yoga and meditation were also organised for teachers and students of the vocational programme, which were led by Mr Melchor Junior Corpuz Parinas, National Coordinator at AMURT. In collaboration with the District Education, Youth and Technology Services, RAF Global organised workshops for teachers for vocational programme on inclusive education, focusing on individuals with special needs and on the importance of teaching ethics. In all, 251 individuals benefitted from the initiatives.

Climate Smart Agriculture

RAF Global has been working to strengthen organic farming and agricultural sustainability through its Climate Smart Agriculture initiative, since 2021. Its interventions aim to enhance food security, environmental sustainability, and economic resilience, particularly for rural farmers and communities.

In the reporting period, **4,412** people were supported under the Climate Smart Agriculture initiative during the review period, with **10 per cent** of them receiving assistance through other initiatives as well.

Of the total participants, **51 per cent** were women.

Organic farming and kitchen gardening

During the review period, 168 farmers of whom, 68 per cent were women, received extensive training in organic farming across Gaza Province. The sessions conducted by government officials from the District Economic Activities Services (SDAE), covered key topics such as vermicomposting, crop production cycles, and the use of bio-fertilisers derived from organic waste. To reinforce learning, farmers took part in hands-on training at demonstration sites and were further supported by ongoing technical guidance and follow-ups from RAF Global and SDAE. The initiative aimed to capacitate participants in accessing information on natural disaster forecasting, such as floods and droughts and in identifying suitable locations for cultivation in different seasons.

RAF Global also facilitated exposure visits to mega agricultural markets at the district level for 10 farmers, of whom 2 were men, from Chongoene district. For them, this was the first such experience, giving them the opportunity to establish market connections, gain insights into large-scale trading, and explore prospects to sell their produce. All programme beneficiaries, who are also part of the self-help initiative, received high-quality seeds, watering cans, and organic sprays to support their farming activities.

Paulo Machava began practising organic farming in 2022 after learning its benefits and techniques in a RAF Global training initiative in Bilene district. In the same year, through a successful experiment on a half-hectare of land, his farm yielded high-quality vegetables and maize, enabling him to increase his profits by reducing the costs of expensive chemical pesticides and fertilisers.

Paulo initially farmed on land granted by District Economic Activities Services (SDAE). Over time, he applied for additional land from the government and gradually expanded his organic farming. In 2024, Paulo, aged 67, cultivated 6.5 hectares of land, growing organic bananas and sugarcane. In addition to his farming efforts, Paulo serves as the president of the farmers' association in the Chichango community, where he guides and supports other farmers in natural farming practices.

He has played a pivotal role in motivating farmers who had abandoned agriculture due to low productivity and the high costs of chemical inputs. The association, formed with the support of RAF Global and SDAE, assists farmers in capacity building, knowledge sharing, market linkages, and organising regular meetings. It has successfully established itself in the market, attracting a strong customer base, including buyers from Maputo, located 150 km away.

Paulo's dedication to organic farming has transformed his life. His returns from farming have enabled him to support his six children and four grandchildren, refurbish his home, invest in livestock farming, and expand his agricultural ventures. Looking ahead, he aims to further strengthen both animal husbandry and crop production.



Orange plantation

RAF Global in collaboration with District Education, Youth and Technology Services (SDEJT) and the District Economic Activities Services carried out a plantation drive in Gaza province. The initiative resulted in the planting of 400 orange saplings across five government schools in Limpopo, Chongoene and Bilene districts. A similar effort, in partnership with AMURT, was implemented at the Early Childhood Development centre in Novunguene, Limpopo. Engaging 400 community members, including school children and vocational students, the effort was to enhance environmental consciousness and promote sustainable land use. This plantation drive builds upon previous initiatives, following the successful planting of over 1,000 moringa saplings in 2022 and 2023, aimed to improve nutritional resources for rural communities. Additionally, RAF Global made consistent efforts to promote the use of moringa products in daily lives through mass awareness sessions, reaching 3,834 community members.

Education and Technology

RAF Global works on improving educational spaces in government schools through infrastructure support, resource mobilisation, digital accessibility, extracurricular engagement and teacher capacity building. It also ensures quality and timely learning for young children through its early childhood programme in Gaza and Maputo Provinces.

During the review period, RAF Global has reached out to **41,036 children**, among whom over **28 per cent** benefitted from at least one more initiatives as well.

Of all the children, **53 per cent** were girls.


Early childhood development

During the review period, 436 children received foundational learning at RAF Global's Early Childhood Development (ECD) centres. The organisation operates centres in two shifts in Limpopo and Bilene (Gaza Province), and Machava (Maputo Province) with the effort to maximise the enrolment of underprivileged children. The centre serves fresh and healthy mid-day meals in collaboration and support of Olam. Additionally, children received essential supplies, including soap, clothing, stationery, and toys, through the year. The Centre of Aspiration for Youths in Mozambique centre, Machava, offers dual benefit – free vocational courses to adults while supporting the educational needs of their young children. Among all programme participants, 54 per cent were female students.



Improving learning spaces in government schools

RAF Global supports government schools in Gaza Province by providing essential supplies of learning and teaching material, utility items, furniture, digital devices for e-classes. The organisation also supported the repair and maintenance of school buildings, classrooms, and computers. As part of the strategic intervention in the review period, students from three schools received notebooks donated by Winner Impex and 29 schools received soaps, contributed by Olam. Both Olam and Winner Impex have been supporting the cause since 2022. In the reporting period, 19 school students benefitted from new dresses contributed by Thread – Dressing Future Leaders. Additionally, three government schools each in Bilene, Limpopo, and Chongoene were equipped with computers, projectors, and modems to enhance digital learning, while another three schools in these districts received library support including: reading books, maps, and charts. In all, 40,061 children benefitted from these initiatives, of whom 53 per cent were girls.



Extra-curricular activities

To foster a spirit of competition and academic excellence, RAF Global, in collaboration with District Education, Youth and Technology Services (SDJET), organised a series of inter-school and intra-school Olympiads, focusing on English pronunciation, reading, mathematics, and general knowledge. These competitions aimed to enhance students' critical thinking, problem-solving abilities, and overall academic engagement. In addition to academic contests, RAF Global also hosted a football tournament, culminating in an exciting final at Chicumbane Secondary School. The event was graced by the presence of Mr Faustino Manjate, District Director of Education, Limpopo, as the chief guest. Additionally, the final round of an academic Olympiad welcomed Mr Virgilio Muchanga, District Administrator of Limpopo, as the chief guest. The Olympiad aimed to reinforce the importance of competitive learning and extracurricular engagement in students' holistic development. Of the 435 students who took part in the events, 63 per cent were female.



Teacher training

To enhance teaching effectiveness, RAF Global partnered with SDJET to deliver a series of professional development workshops in Gaza. The sessions covered leadership, professional ethics, self-esteem, and inclusive education for students with special needs. Additionally, IT teachers from three schools attended a technical training on digital teaching tools and technical proficiency. The schools were also equipped with computers, projectors, and modems to enhance digital learning. Overall, the initiative covered 104 teachers.



Good Governance

RAF Global's Good Governance initiative, launched in Mozambique in 2022, aims to transform public service delivery through a community-centric, single-window, service model. By partnering with key government agencies, the initiative simplifies access to legal identity documents, enhances bureaucratic efficiency, and strengthens social inclusion, particularly for women and marginalised populations.

In the reporting period, **905** people were supported under the good governance initiative.

Of the total participants, **60 per cent** were women.

Public information service camps

RAF Global in collaboration with government departments – Autoridade Tributaria (Tax Authority), Directorate of Civil Identification and District Registration and Notary Service, organised two public information service camps in each district – Limpopo, Chongoene and Bilene. The community based camps helped rural residents in obtaining national documents like, identity cards, Unique Tax Identification Number and birth certificates through a single window. A total of 905 individuals are estimated to have benefitted from the initiative and among them, 78 women belonged to broken families who otherwise faced severe challenges in obtaining these vital documents. Of all the beneficiaries of the camps, 60 per cent were women.



World Hearing Day

A screening programme was organised for students and teachers at Primary School in Chongoene. The initiative helped in addressing and treating hearing issues early, benefitting a total of 628 students.

Global Handwashing Day

At Primary School, Xai-Xai, 1,000 students and community members engaged in hand washing demonstrations and a singing competition to promote hand hygiene.

World Menstrual Hygiene Day

500 students of Martires de Mueda Primary School, Nhancutse in Chongoene were made aware about homemade pad production and menstrual hygiene.

World Sight Day

An ophthalmology fair was held at an elderly care centre in Messano town. The initiative provided eye check-ups and care support to 900 individuals, emphasising the need for accessible eye care.

World Skills Day

Students participated in a stitching competition at RAF Global's vocational centre in Xai-Xai District, Gaza Province. The event fostered creativity and skill development, with winners receiving prizes for their outstanding work.

World Toilet Day

An awareness programme was organised at Xipenhane Primary School, Siaia in Bilene. With 800 participants from the school and community, the event aimed to raise awareness about hygiene and sanitation practices.

World Children's Day

At ECD Novungunene (Limpopo district), 250 children were engaged in fun and meaningful activities that promoted well-being and development.
